



Fort Adams Overnight Rental Options

Available April-October* | Can't be booked more than 4 months in advance

Restored Barracks Bunk House

Rental fee: \$900/night

Accommodates up to 38 people

Includes:**

- 1.5 hour guided tour of Fort Adams
- 3 bunk rooms
- 4 modern bathrooms
- 1 common room with sink, mini fridge & oak tables



Tented Camping

Minimum fee: \$400 per night (0-15 ppl)

Additional \$20 per person above 15 ppl



Includes:**

- 1.5 hour guided tour of Fort Adams
- water access
- port-a-john access

*can extend season based on weather

**Neither bunk house or camping is tents or bedding provided

General Rules and Information:

1. **Supervision:** There must be full adult supervision at all times. All groups require a 10:1 youths/adult ratio. Group chaperones are expected to provide contact information for all participants parents or guardians to Fort Adams.

2. **No Go Areas:** Much of the interior of Fort Adams is unrestored and potentially dangerous. At no time may guests enter any area protecting the historic structure which surrounds the Parade Field. Swimming in the boat basin is prohibited.

3. **Security:** It is imperative that the Fort be locked at all times after hours. Group leaders must establish a procedure for leaving the Fort and returning that does not leave the gate(s) open in the interim.

4. **Cleaning:** All groups staying overnight are responsible for cleaning the facilities. During orientation the group leaders will be told where cleaning supplies are located, as well as their proper application. Any group found to leave the facility in an unsatisfactory condition will forfeit their damage deposit.

5. **Trash Disposal:** Historic Fort Adams is a carry-in/ carry-out facility and all groups utilizing the Overnight Barracks and camping facilities must adhere to this policy.

6. **Accessibility:** The Overnight Barrack and its bathroom facilities are handicapped accessible. However, much of this historic structure can be difficult to access. Please check with the Trust staff, in advance, if you have any specific questions or concerns.

General Rules and Information Cont.

7. Health and Safety: Any specific medical condition or need must be brought to the attention of the Fort Adams Trust prior to arrival. All injuries must be reported on a visitor incident report and provided to the Trust before departure.

8. Damage: Leaders are responsible to ensure no damage is done to any of the buildings, walls, windows, furniture, floors, or to any physical aspect of the Fort.

9. Fire Safety: NO open flame permitted inside the overnight barracks. If a group desires to cook using a propane stove or charcoal grill, you must do so outside. Any charcoals must be carried out of the park and not left on the premises.

10. Campfires: There are designated fire pits in Fort Adams. All overnight groups can utilize these pit for their fires. The turf on the Parade Field must be restored to its original condition after the fire. Bonfires are strictly prohibited

11. Utilities: The Overnight Barrack has been equipped with electricity, a telephone, indoor plumbing and refrigeration. Additional water is available at the faucet outside the Overnight Barracks. In season, additional bathrooms are located in the Visitor Center, during regular park hours. **There is no heat in the overnight Barracks.**

12. Vehicle Use: All vehicles must be kept outside the Fort walls overnight in State Park parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for all vehicles upon arrival. Vehicles used to deposit food and equipment may travel through the East Gate and around the Parade Field along the walkway. No vehicle may drive on the grass inside Fort Adams.

The sizes of the entrance gates are:

East Gate: 7 ft. high x 10 ft. wide (with a steep incline) North Gate: 9.5 ft. high x 8 ft. wide (moderate to slight steep incline)

General Rules and Information Cont.

13. Showering: The overnight barracks has been equipped with one shower located in the bathroom of the chaperones quarters. This shower is to be used sparingly and on a need to use basis. No showers are available for camping.

14. Keys: Two sets of keys will be provided on arrival. On each set there is a key for the padlocks on the East and North gates of the Fort as well as a key for the Overnight barracks. Both sets must be returned to the Fort Adams Trust before your departure.

15. Lights Out: All evening activities must end by 10:00p.m. This means all fires must be fully doused, supplies and food secured and all group members must be inside the Overnight Barracks or their respective tents. All gates must remain locked overnight, unless an emergency should arise.

16. Animals: There are raccoons, bats, skunks, fox and various other animals that reside within Historic Fort Adams. Beware of leaving food unattended and unsecured **never** leave doors or windows open after dark as bats may fly into the barracks!

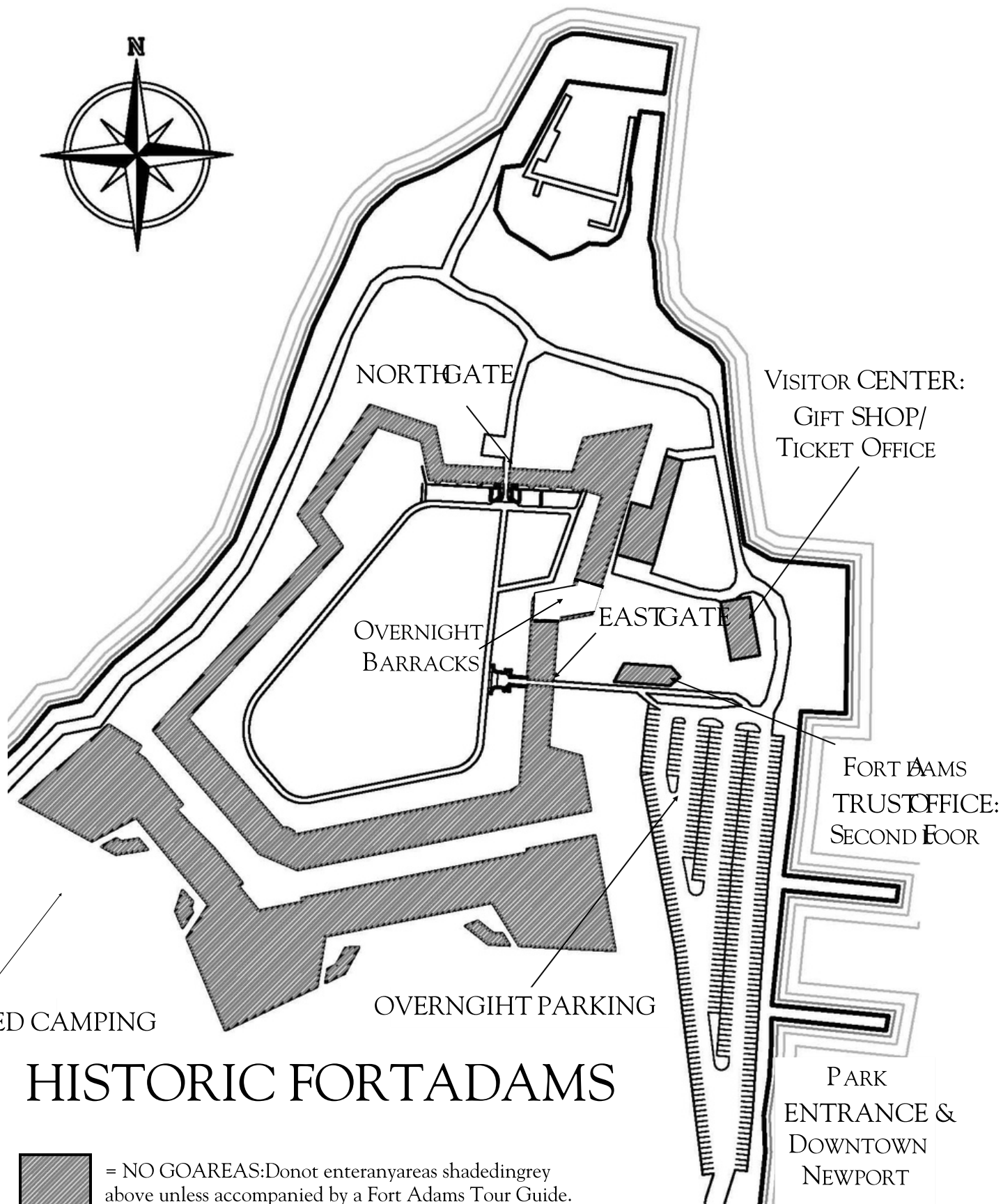
17. Disciplinary Problems: If at any time during your stay it is felt that a member of your group is not following our Code of Conduct, the Fort Adams Trust has the right to immediately eject that individual. In such case, it is the responsibility of the group leader to arrange for a parent or guardian to pick up this individual.

General Rules and Information Cont.

18. Emergencies: If there is a life threatening emergency call 911. If non life threatening, call the Department of Environmental Management Environmental Police 24-hour report line at 222-3070. The Fort Adams Trust office may be reached at (401) 841-0707. Unless otherwise specified your Trust contact, after business hours, is Robert McCormack, Director of Visitor Experience, at (401) 316-1124. An orange emergency contact sheet and first aid box may be found in the electrical closet located in the back hallway leading toward the bathrooms.

19. Insurance: Any group staying overnight in the Fort is required to provide a Certificate of General Liability Insurance of \$1,000,000 for any one person per occurrence and \$2,000,000 in general aggregate. You can purchase this insurance through the Fort Adams Trust for a fee.

20. Payment: A 50% deposit is needed to secure a reservation. The full balance must be paid prior to your stay. Payments can be made by credit card or checks

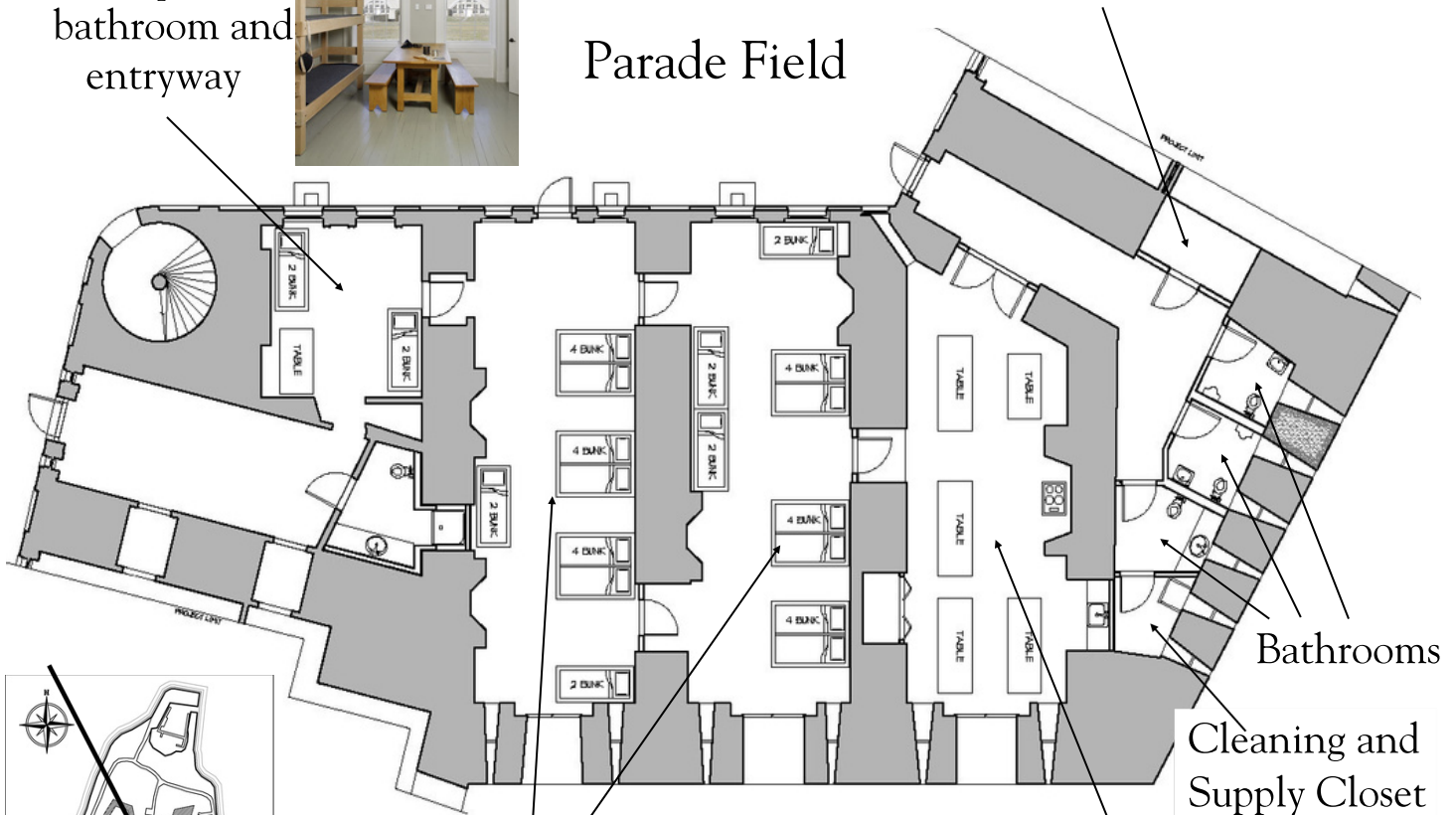

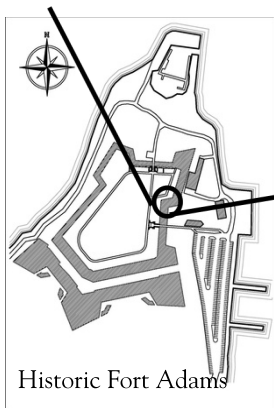

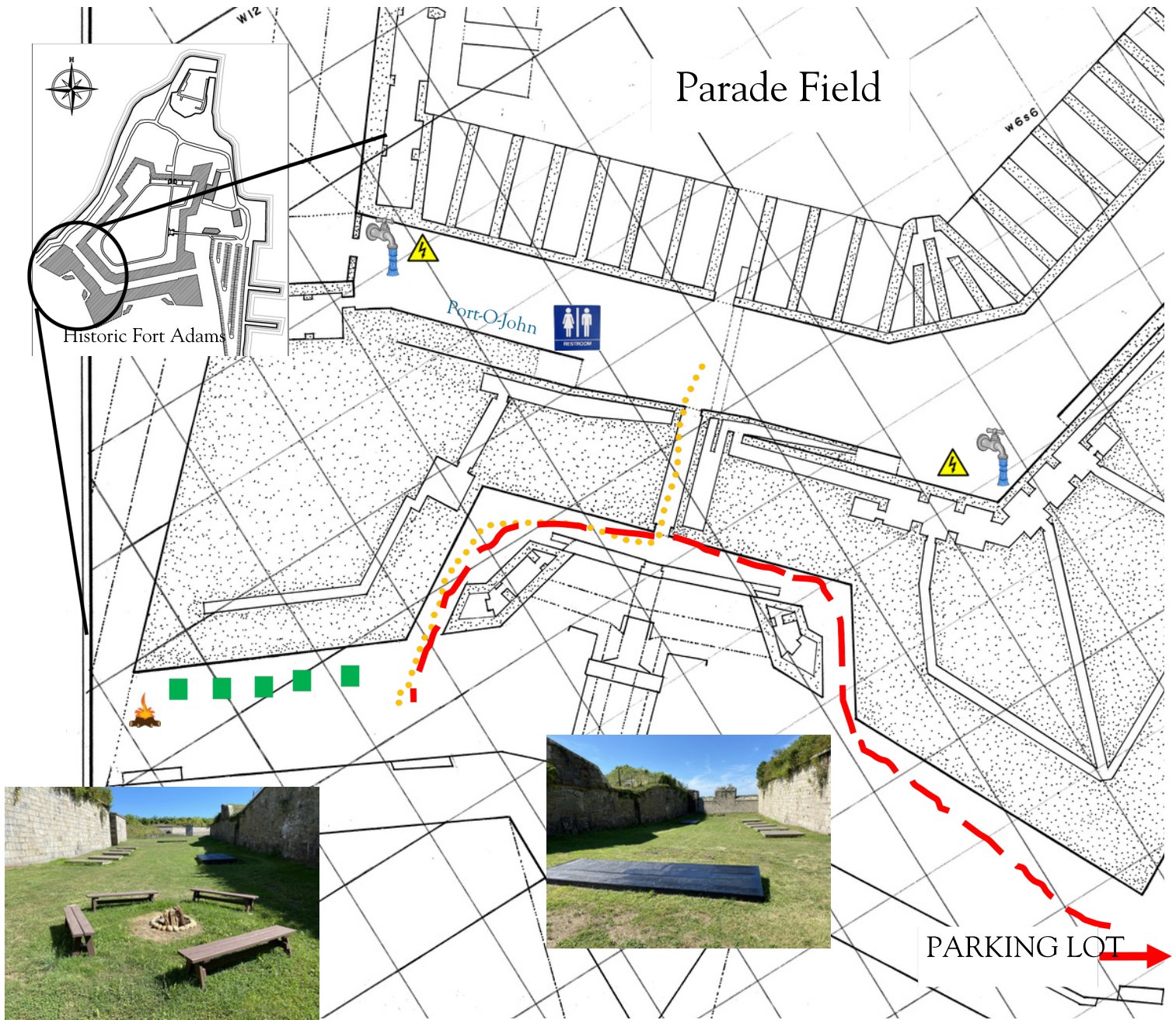
